### **COMMUNITY REFLECTION**

# MISSION TO THE YOUNG - 6 LIGHT A CANDLE INSTEAD OF CURSING THE DARKNESS

My dear confreres,

As we are reflecting about our mission to the young in the second year of our preparation for the Silver Jubilee of our province, I would like to exhort all of us to have a closer look at our mission and apostolate. While on the one hand we are grateful to the Lord for the immense blessings and countless miracles happening in many of our presences, on the other hand there is a need to multiply our efforts and work hard for the salvation of souls especially that of the young entrusted to our care. I will be sharing in detail what all we can do to better our apostolate in the future in my next circular. Yet, I just want to start off the spark in this circular too.

Recently we had a meeting for all the administrators about planning and budgeting. I am happy that most of the administrators participated and learnt the techniques of budgeting. We also have other trainings for planning for the academic year like the updating of the SEPP (Salesian Educative Pastoral Plan), the YMP (Youth Ministry Plan), the Annual Plan, etc. In the beginning of the academic year, all the sectors, commissions and departments meet individually to plan for the year. Hence, plans are excellent. But, how about the execution of the plans and budgets? What is the quality of our systems and lines of action? Is there any plan for the same?

### 01. Playing One's Role Well Is Essential for Effective Ministry

In my experience and also listening to the experience of so many other religious, it is true that we have a good system of governance in our congregation and our province is known for effective administration as well. But still, there are a few Rectors who feel that they are everything in the community. In spirit, it is true that the Rector represents the community, and he is center of the community. But in practice, the ideal way of running the community is to delegate and distribute the responsibilities to all. We are not exercising military rule in our houses and that is not the Salesian style at all. The role of the Rector is to animate in such a way that everything goes well in the community. He may feel that he is not doing anything in particular or he has not contributed to something directly. Never mind that at all. At times, that should be the right feeling of the Rector. Article 55 tells very clearly, "The Rector coordinates the efforts of all, bearing in mind the rights, duties and capabilities of every member." This is also applicable to every member of the community whoever is holding a responsibility to animate the community in various fields.

At the same time, the members also have a bounden duty to work in collaboration with the Rector. Recently, I came to know that there was a farewell organized in the community but in the absence of the Rector or rather the Rector was not informed about the farewell at all. I come to know that some of the parish priests never call the Rector for the Parish council meeting or discuss with him all the events and developments of the parish. This is diocesan mentality and not Salesian style at all. Bypassing the Rector and doing any activity in the Salesian community or in any sector of the apostolate should be totally avoided. It is not enough to give information to the Rector about various decisions, but due permission is absolutely necessary. Let us play our roles well so that the mission and the apostolate may flourish.

# 02. Walking An Extra Mile Is a Good Spirit to Be Followed

There is no substitute to hard work. There is no boundary or limits for hard work too. If you are burning with zeal and enthusiasm, there is no need for reminders and exhortation. Maintaining the status quo is very easy and comfortable. Walking an extra mile is tough and difficult. I adore and admire many of our confreres who think outside the box and dare to be different but contributing everything of themselves for the mission. They are the evangelizers and missionaries of today. It is because of such noble souls that many of our works are bearing good fruits. But there are quite a lot of confreres who need to learn what hard work is. While they can roam around the whole world for their personal program, they find it impossible to travel even a short distance for the sake of the mission. We all should remember the words of our father Don Bosco, "when ease and comfort enter our congregation, it would have run its course." Hence, as we are going to start a new academic year, it is only fitting that we prepare ourselves for hard work so that we may contribute our best for the mission.

Qualification is given great importance today and I am happy many confreres request me to send them for higher studies. But what happens after their study is more crucial because there are so many qualified but very few who pursue their field of study. Still worse, there are a few who decide on an area of ministry of their own. Let us not forget that we are all religious who should do what the congregation wants us to do. We should be able to sacrifice our own principles and ambition for the sake of the province and the congregation. Though I am a promoter of individuals excelling in their own fields, I cannot forget the religious rule of the common good that is more important. Therefore, what matters the most is the best that we can offer to the young.

## 03. Good Community Life Is the First Requisite for Best Apostolate

I know very well that you are all tired of this topic that I am referring to again and again. But I am convinced about the fact that this is the only thing that matters for us Salesians in our religious life. How is that when certain individuals are there in the community, the mission flourishes and when others join that community, the apostolate perishes? Or when one Rector is there, the mission is at its heights and when another Rector reaches that community, the apostolate goes to rock bottom? It is interesting to note the statement of one Rector who says, "I have to set right everything in this house," and when he is transferred to another house, the next Rector repeats the same phrase again. I just wonder who has actually set things right. I guess, it is not the Rector or one of the confreres who sets the tone for the community but every member of the community who should fall in line with the community. It is not important that individual confrere wins over the community, but it is better that the community wins over the individuals in the community. This is the Salesian community.

After meeting all of you personally I come to know that the ninety nine percent of our problems are that of the community living. We want to change everyone but let us not forget that it is easy to change ourselves than others. What is pertinent is the commitment and dedication of individuals in the community. If that suffers, the community is doomed to die. Community does not exist in isolation or in the air. It is the individuals that make up the community. I wish and pray that we may all enjoy our community life in the coming academic year so that the mission may bear good fruits.

And finally, my dear confreres, we are given many opportunities to share and grow. Let us make use of them positively and become happy givers. At the end of every retreat, we have a dialogue session introduced this year so that we may receive more information and clarification. But there are not many making use of it. I am sure these occasions will help us to get rid of loose talk, gossip and grumbling going around in the province. We cannot put an end to everything but let us light a candle instead of cursing the darkness.
