COMMUNITY REFLECTION

TOWARDS SILVER JUBILEE - YEAR 3: SPIRITUALITY OF WITNESS Spreading the Fragrance of Goodness

After the ordination, I was sent to Savariyarpalayam parish for the pastoral ministry. I had very good formation as a young priest, for which I have been grateful to God all my life. Everyone knows well about the organization of the parishes in the Dindigul region. Nattamais (village leaders) control the parish priest and his decisions. So too was the

system in that parish as well. The people cannot approach the priest on their own; rather, they must be accompanied by the Nattamai of their area. People cannot express their requests to the parish priest, but the Nattamai will speak on behalf of them. The parish priest cannot decide on anything concerning the parish, but he must just obey the wishes of the Nattamais. In such a context, I made a house visit of all the families of the parish as soon as I became the parish priest and worked towards forming anbiams and the parish council. It was not an easy task at all. I went through agony and suffering every day. The Nattamai system opposed me in everything because I was making efforts to create an alternative system for the governance of the parish and its administration.

At that time, the parish priest of the Cathedral Church was Rev. Fr. Peter Raj, fondly called Kallarasu, who recently passed away due to ill health. He had been my professor at the Poonamallee seminary too. He came to know all the happenings and fights in the parish where I was and gave me a piece of advice that can never be forgotten. "My dear Agilan, I know that you are undergoing pain and agony every day in your parish. But remember, not even in prayer should you think of retaliating against your people, especially those who are working against you. Pray for them and be good to them. You will receive your reward in heaven." He reminded me of the Bible, Mt 5:44-45, "But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous." I am grateful to him for not only advising me but also for standing with me, encouraging me to go through challenges, and to remain a good priest always. May God rest his soul.

Being good is difficult, and spreading the fragrance of goodness is more difficult. But once we taste the sweetness of being good, we will never give it up for anything. On the contrary, we will spread that goodness to everyone around us, and it will catch up like wildfire. Unfortunately, people who are good are silent and unnoticed. They do not come out in the open to fight against evil. Not that they would succumb to pressure, but they do not want to lose their goodness in the fight. I feel the spirituality of witness invites us not to remain silent and quiet. We cannot be happily going to heaven alone. We must accompany as many as possible to heaven. That's the reason why Don Bosco advised his Salesians to pray by making the boys pray. Let me give you some lines of action in this line about how we can spread the fragrance of goodness around us.

O1. Credibility and Authenticity Stand First: There are many good preachers, but it is very difficult to live with them. One of the provincials shared with me in the meeting, "I have four preachers in my province. They go around preaching to the whole world and converting everyone, but they cannot fit into a community or take directions from the leader." If I were to be in his place, I would put all four in one community and allow them to choose a leader by themselves. I will appoint the one chosen and make sure they live together for a few years. It is better to spoil one community than to distribute four and spoil four communities. I know some of you

are smiling as you read these lines, but the fact is true. We always want the other to be correct and better. But when it concerns us, we always justify ourselves. I quote the Bible: "Why do you see the speck in your neighbor's eye, but do not notice the log in your own eye? First take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your neighbor's eye." Mt 7:3-5. We have some confreres who think highly of themselves. But their life is so low. Some are obsessed with the thoughts of themselves alone, their degrees, portfolios, advantages, and the like. Good and credible people never put themselves in the limelight or take the front seat in life. Rather, they always give their place to others at every given opportunity and happily remain silent.

- 02. Good People Stand for Values: There is a new culture creeping into our religious life. When someone makes a mistake, we keep quiet and wait for someone else to correct the offender. Or make a lot of noise about the superior, who is not making efforts to punish the offender. I guess good people will not watch and pray when evil is taking the upper hand. Rather, they will make every effort to put off the fire from the beginning and fight till the end, even if the fire destroys the whole place. God looks into our efforts, not the results. The Church is built on the blood of martyrs. The congregation has flourished because of the innumerable sacrifices of the Salesians who have gone before us. Therefore, each of us should have the urge to stand for values. We should visibly show this in our actions too. For example, when someone is talking nonsense during a meeting, anyone should be able to put an end to it at the earliest. Why should we wait for the leader to stop him? I am not suggesting this because I am a leader now. I am just reflecting the attitude of many these days. Some people begin their arguments by saying, 'I disagree with him' or 'I too agree with him." Why should one agree with another or disagree with anyone at all? Rather, you should agree with the idea proposed or disagree with a suggestion given. Good people stand for values and do not support people blindly because they like them or they belong to the same group.
- 03. <u>United We Stand</u>, <u>Divided We Fall</u>: One should not misunderstand this statement and take it for numerical unity. I mean, good people should stand together against evil. There may be divisive forces against good people, but they should not succumb to pressure and tactics. Rather, they should be together, and there should be unity in quality and quantity. Unfortunately, we do not find this in our times. Many are wanting to keep away from standing for good and coming out openly in public. They fear of being excluded from the group. I ask a question: What have you gained by belonging to your group all these years? Have they assured you of heaven or at

least some happiness in this world? You should fear God and not humans, and the least for those who promote their own groups. Have your heads on your shoulders and be bold to stand for what is right. And more so, all those who stand for what is right should stand together. This is the unity that I am referring to, and this will take us to real happiness, which can never be taken away from us.

04. Forgive and Forget: After doing all that we can, the final attitude should be 'let go.' It can happen that things do not happen the way we have imagined. Or evil may dominate and take pleasure in a momentary success. Good people never get discouraged, and at the same time, they never lose hope as well. 'This too will pass away,' is their guiding principle, and they will continue to work harder towards achieving more good. The wounds and worries do not linger any longer in them; rather, they easily forgive the offenders, forget the situations, and go ahead with fresh vigor and energy. It is the goal that matters, not the stumbling blocks during the onward journey of life. This is what the Christian doctrine inspires us, and Jesus is our best model: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." Lk 23:34.

As we are in the Easter season, my dear confreres let us rise and soar high in ideals that promote good and spread the fragrance of goodness everywhere and at every opportunity. It's easy to give up. Jesus died, but on the third day, he rose again and lives on forever. So too, we should live forever spreading the fragrance of goodness. My fervent prayers for all of you in this Eastertide are that the resurrected Jesus may be with us always, especially in the journey of our life of goodness.
