Summer Apostolate

The second years from Kavarapettai will be available from April 20, 2024. After the summer apostolate, they will come back to the provincial house for two days of animation and evaluation of the summer ministry before going to the theologate. The leaders must ensure the regular rhythm of the community during these days, especially the prayer moments. For those clerics due for perpetuals, a meeting will be held on Saturday, March 02, 2024, at Don Bosco Provincial House, Kallukuzhy. Fr. Applications for Perpetual and Renewal

I recommend all community members to accompany our young Salesians during their journey of discernment. The province secretary has already sent the details of the list of those due for renewals and perpetual professions and the related documents to the Rectors. I exhort the leaders to ensure prompt response and cooperation in this regard.

COMMUNITY REFLECTION

TOWARDS SILVER JUBILEE - YEAR 3: SPIRITUALITY OF WITNESS

Realizing the Value of Our Vocation and Formation will Make Us Witnesses

My personal experience of Salesian life in the past many years is certainly memorable. I feel that the Salesian Formation is the best. I do not want to compare with others because each one is unique in nature and individuals may be taken up with their own formation. But from my experience and from many others who have been in the Salesian congregation for some time of their lives, they seem to agree with me as well. During this year, I have been sharing this aspect in the conference of the visitation of the houses. I want to put it in writing as well, so that it may not be forgotten. Why do I say that our Salesian formation is the best?

1. The number of years that we go through in our formation is not exactly the number of years in calculation, but the number of years given to us to get in touch with the divine, to get enlightened, and to have a feel of the supernatural at some point, like the Sadhus and Gurus of our Indian tradition. Merely going through years learning different things for our priestly life does not make us real priests, but pursuing holiness should be the purpose of our entire life. That is the reason we are not professionals in the career of priesthood; on the contrary, we are disciples of the Lord, going through an experience of the Lord all the time. Formation houses need

formators and not simply teachers and scholars, because only the former could give an experience of formation, while the latter could only give knowledge and intelligence.

- 2. Last year, when I went abroad, I had the opportunity to meet a few of the Salesians who were in the congregation for a few years in the past but now are living their Salesian charism in the world. Each of them acknowledged that it was the Salesian formation that helped them form their careers and lives. How wonderful it is to hear from those who have gone away from us physically but keep the Salesian charism close to their hearts! One of them remembered the good nights given by various Salesians and what an impact they had on his life. I was pleasantly surprised and shared with a few, "No wonder he is doing so well in the corporate world today." At the same time, he did not fail to share the other side of the story: "If only those who are in the congregation remembered the good nights and practiced them in their lives, there would be a few more saints in the congregation today."
- 3. Going through the candidates who joined our province in the past years, I have come to know that more than 50 percent of the candidates are from non-Salesian contexts, all referred by diocesan priests or other religious priests and nuns. A few of the clerics who are in the initial formation shared with me their experience. They wanted to join some other congregation because their relative priests were there, but those priests seemed to have told the candidates, "Do not join us but join the Salesians because their charism is very relevant today, their community life is good, and you can develop your potential and talents well and make a meaningful life in the future." The whole world appreciates us and admires our formation, but what about us, who are the permanent members of the congregation? Do we really relish and feel joyful about our own formation?
- 4. The benefactors and donors at times put us to shame with their trust and confidence in us. I am sure it is not because all the Salesians are wonderful and perfect; they carry out the mission in the best way possible, and they continue to help us. In fact, because they like our charism and see a few Salesians who are exemplary and working hard, they offer their continued support. We must all keep in mind that these benefactors are not very rich in money and property, but they are filthy rich in their faith in Don Bosco and his charism. Hence, each of us needs to appreciate and admire the life of the Salesian vocation God has given to each of us and needless to say about the great responsibility we should cultivate in our religious life.

Let us begin to appreciate our Salesian formation every day of our lives. I somehow feel that only those who have abundance can also give generously to others. Only those who are happy and joyful in their lives can pass on the same happiness to others. Those who are unhappy in their Salesian life not only cannot contribute to the community, but they will also become failures in the mission. How wonderful to see many Salesians going about their

lives bubbling with energy and enthusiasm! These are the people who will make a difference in the Salesian youth ministry. And we need many of them today in our province. I wish and pray that all of us become like that, enjoying our everyday life. May

the Risen Jesus give us that joy and happiness.
