
#### DEAR CONFRERES,

### **COMMUNITY REFLECTION**

## SILVER JUBILEE OF THE PROVINCE OF TIRUCHY – WAY FORWARD 2. Intimacy In The Mission

The provincial visitation is going on in the province these days, and I have visited 12 communities so far. It is wonderful to witness an enormous number of activities carried out in various houses. Our campuses are filled with young people, children, and others who exhibit joy and happiness in their lives. The spiritual vibration of the people in the parishes is growing day by day, and a greater number of people are tuned to living the spirituality. Pious associations are increasing in numbers, and the members are becoming positive and exemplary. They contribute their might for the welfare of the people entrusted to their care. Institutions are focused on the formation of children and young people, and results are great and encouraging. The young at risk are specially cared for, and it's wonderful to see their happy faces radiating joy and optimism in life. In short, I must say that the Lord is blessing us with gifts and blessings day after day, especially as we are in the Jubilee year. We are grateful to the Lord for everything that has happened in the past, and we look forward to a bright future.

Let me enumerate some aspects of our mission that will help us to move forward in life focused on maximum goals and results.

## 01. The mission is entrusted to the Salesian Community. Hence, the members should be able to sacrifice their individual differences for the sake of the mission:

Art. 45 of our constitution tells us, "Each of us is responsible for the common mission, and participates in it with the richness of his own personal gifts." When we go through the

history of the province and individual houses, this aspect of working together in a community has been very strong, and that has paved the way for huge development of our works and activities. The rural presences are the best examples of the hard work of the early Salesians, and they were living amidst challenges of different types. I am sure they did not have proper facilities of accommodation, food, and entertainment. But they were immersed in the mission and enjoyed the ministry to the full. It is true that the problems are multifaceted today. And we need even more to be available and faithful to the mission entrusted to us.

There is a tendency in individuals to give more importance to their personal programs and schedules. We have a good tradition in the province that priority is given to the province and community-level programs first, and only then should the individuals plan their program. This needs to be strictly adhered to if we need to achieve greater results in our mission. Reactions like resigning the portfolios, walking out, etc. should be avoided. Better dialogue and discussion must be initiated at all levels. The leaders should be more patient and aim at bringing all the members together for the mission even if members do not cooperate. If there is a need, the individuals should be able to sacrifice their comforts for the sake of the mission of the community. Once the goals are clear and well set, all should march towards the same no matter what the challenges and difficulties may be.

## 02. Hard work without counting the cost will reap good fruits. The members should work towards the maximum:

The work culture of our ancestors is to be admired and appreciated. We wonder how people were able to work so hard and achieve the results expected. The commitment and dedication of the pioneers and missionaries of our province is certainly something to be followed today. Don Bosco was a man who built many churches at the same time besides the founding of the congregation and taking care of its growth and development amidst a multitude of challenges. He is our model and example. The residence and other facilities of all our houses, including those in the rural areas, are far better now than before. The number of confreres working in the individual presences is increasing year by year. The budget is also escalated, and the whole style of life is of good standards in the present scenario. But what is the output?

There are confreres who are after degrees and qualifications. Degrees are important, and the province has spent money and resources in qualifying our confreres. But what are the results? Are the qualified confreres scaling up the standards of our mission by their contribution? Are the developments equal to the investments made? As a leader of the province, while on the one hand, I adore some of the confreres for their hard work and commitment, I must bring to the notice of the province, the growing number of younger confreres who are complacent in doing the minimum or doing nothing at all. Some are draining the resources of the province and are becoming liabilities. It's sad to see them unhappy and becoming negative towards life. It's time now to wake up and keep the fire burning and our passion spreading to all around us. Let us contribute our best. Let us reach the heights at the earliest.

# 03. Creativity in our mission is the need of the hour. Variety and newness should become our constant companions in our ministry:

There is no doubt about our institutions, which have brought about a huge transformation of society. Education has been an important tool for empowering the poor and underprivileged. Our boardings and hostels have been agents of upliftment and encouragement to the youth, who are the hallmarks in many of the corporates in India and abroad. Lots of creativity has gone through our services and initiatives in the past years, and some of the works like the care for the HIV and young at risk are some of the monuments that will always stand in history. Almost all the departments have been the brainchild of some of the confreres who have thought wild for long and finally given shape to them. We are certainly marching on the right track in youth ministry.

I guess we have a long way to go in this journey, leaping into the dark courageously and boldly. Many times the path may not be visible and clear, and there may be hurdles and blocks all along the way, but they are not perennial or dead ends. Though the light may be bleak and thin, our efforts will make them bright and strong. Don Bosco was a man for the signs of the times, and he was considered mad at times.
