**Domestic Staff Tour to Goa:** As we are in the silver jubilee year of our province, to share our token of love for the domestic staff who are working in our province, a two-day tour to Goa was organized on November 22 and 23, 2024. A total of 60 staff members joined the tour. They departed from Tiruchy on 21 morning, traveling to Chennai by train and then to Goa by air. Similarly, they returned to Tiruchy on 24 morning. They were also fortunate to have a closer look at the relic of St. Francis Xavier, which is exposed once every ten years. Higher Education Institutions' Meet (DBHEI): The Annual General Meeting of the Don Bosco Higher Education Institutions in India (DBHEI) was held from 15th to 17th November 2023 at Salesian College, Sonada. 73 representatives from 57 Salesian institutions of higher education in India participated. Fr Rajadevan Pushpanathan, Provincial Delegate for Higher Education, Fr. Peter Arockiaraj and Fr. Prince Raja were the representatives from our province. The meeting focused on innovation in higher education, including leadership, partnerships, AI integration, industry-academia collaboration, international exposure, and entrepreneurship. Fr. George Thadathil SDB, the General Coordinator of Salesian Institutions of Higher Education (IUS), Rome also addressed the meeting and mentioned about the multifold opportunities that are available to us in the field of higher education today. We congratulate our confrere Fr. Prince Raja who has been elected as the executive member of DBHEI.

National Catholic Media Conference – The Illuminaire 2024 conference was held on November 23-24 at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore. Organized by the Salesian Social Communication Sector (Rome), BOSCOM India, and the Vatican Dicastery for Communication, the event aimed to equip Catholic leaders with digital skills to effectively serve the Church's mission in the digital age. Around 300 priests and religious from India attended, including Fr. Arockia Selvakumar, Provincial Delegate for Social Communication,

and Fr. Francis Britto from our province. Key speakers included Dr Paolo Ruffini, Prefect of the Vatican Dicastery for Communication; Fr Gildásio Mendes, General Councillor for Social Communication; Mr Derek O'Brien, member of Parliament; and Fr Cedric Prakash SJ, renowned human rights and social justice activist. The conference covered topics such as digital ministry, social media, AI, and digital wellness. It provided valuable insights and practical guidance for religious leaders to navigate the digital landscape and leverage technology for evangelization.

Don Bosco Past Pupils AGM: The association of the past pupils of Don Bosco, Tiruchy provincial federation had its annual general body meeting at Don Bosco College of Arts and Science, Keela Eral on 24 November 2024. There were altogether seventy-five members from eleven past pupils local units of our presences who took part in the meeting. It is an annual event wherein the past pupils come together at the province level to express their joy, gratitude, connect, discuss and evaluate their activities and to plan for the future course of action. # **COMMUNITY REFLECTION**

# SILVER JUBILEE OF THE PROVINCE OF TIRUCHY – WAY FORWARD 3. Credibility and Witnessing Life

The whole world admires Pope Francis for his simplicity of life and authenticity of character. There is so much talked about him, and many books are written about his qualities and his style of life. What is special about him, as I see him, is his credibility. A man who speaks what he believes and lives what he believes, and therefore there is so much oneness with his words and life.

Many wondered why he took the name Francis. He, being a Jesuit, should have decided to take the name of Ignatius. I guess he wanted to be more inclusive. Traditionally, many of the popes were following the Benedictine spirituality, giving more importance to spirituality and spiritual outlook of life. Descending from the Jesuit tradition, Pope Francis was fully aware of the Ignatian spirituality, which is popular all over the world, and there are so many following it faithfully. But somehow the name Francis was very attractive to

the Pope. I believe Saint Francis was a person who was very inclusive. He had a strong power of authority in humility. He could free his life from everything and yet possess everything in life. He had nothing for him, and yet he was a happy and fulfilled person.



Hence, he attracted many followers. He could call the sun his brother and the moon his sister. He was a lover of nature, and he went beyond the limits of humanity to become a being of the universe. That's the reason why the Pope took the name Francis.

All of us are aware of the words spoken by the Pope when he was asked to describe himself when he became the Pope by the interviewers. He said humbly," I am a sinner and in need of forgiveness." In a world where he is considered the number one spiritual leader, his humble words became so powerful and profound that he proved his character as a good leader.

Humility is the first requisite for credibility. Pope Francis took to the balcony with the word "Bishop" crossing his lips more than "pope" or "pontiff." He referred to himself first as the Bishop of Rome and to Benedict XVI not as a retired pope but as an emeritus bishop. There was something genuine about the way he referred to the journey of faith as one that he and the faithful take together in love and trust. He asked for help and the favour of a prayer—but this wasn't the standard "pray for me." Pope Francis bowed to receive that prayer from the people of God he now serves. He abandoned the palace of the Popes and decided to live in a simple apartment. It is said even as an archbishop, he lived in a small apartment. He loves to visit the poor and the abandoned, and that's why he could advise the shepherds to love the smell of the sheep. He fell on his knees and kissed the feet of the leaders so that there could be peace in the world. This genuine gesture inspired the whole world, and certainly Pope Francis is a living saint.

My dear confreres, all of us need to become humble and credible as Salesians living amidst the young people. They are looking for models and witnesses. What we can offer to them is not something outside of us but ourselves and our witnessing lives. After going around the province and getting to know more and more about our confreres, the situation of our houses, and



the mindset of people in our region, I come to understand that many people believe that authority is power or at least those who are in authority are powerful. It's not true. The real power is humility. Great people have always been humble till the end of their lives. God lifts the lowly.

We had the batch meetings this year, and it's surprising to hear the topic on the appointment of leaders again and again. All of us know well that we don't need to be a leader or hold some portfolio to do good. The ability to do good is innate in everyone. That goodness grows gradually and becomes more visible when someone assumes responsibility. But all those who are in power need not possess that goodness. That's why I say seeking power and position disqualifies the person from assuming that role or responsibility, because they are not looking for service but want to enjoy authority. Thus, they are selfish in their intention. As long as people are selfish and cozy, they can never be oriented towards goodness or service. Generosity will not be in their dictionary. We must remember the gospel that motivates us: "I came to serve and not be served." Let us follow the example of Pope Francis in our lives. Let us become credible and authentic in our religious life. Let our witnessing life move the hearts of young people towards the newborn Jesus.
